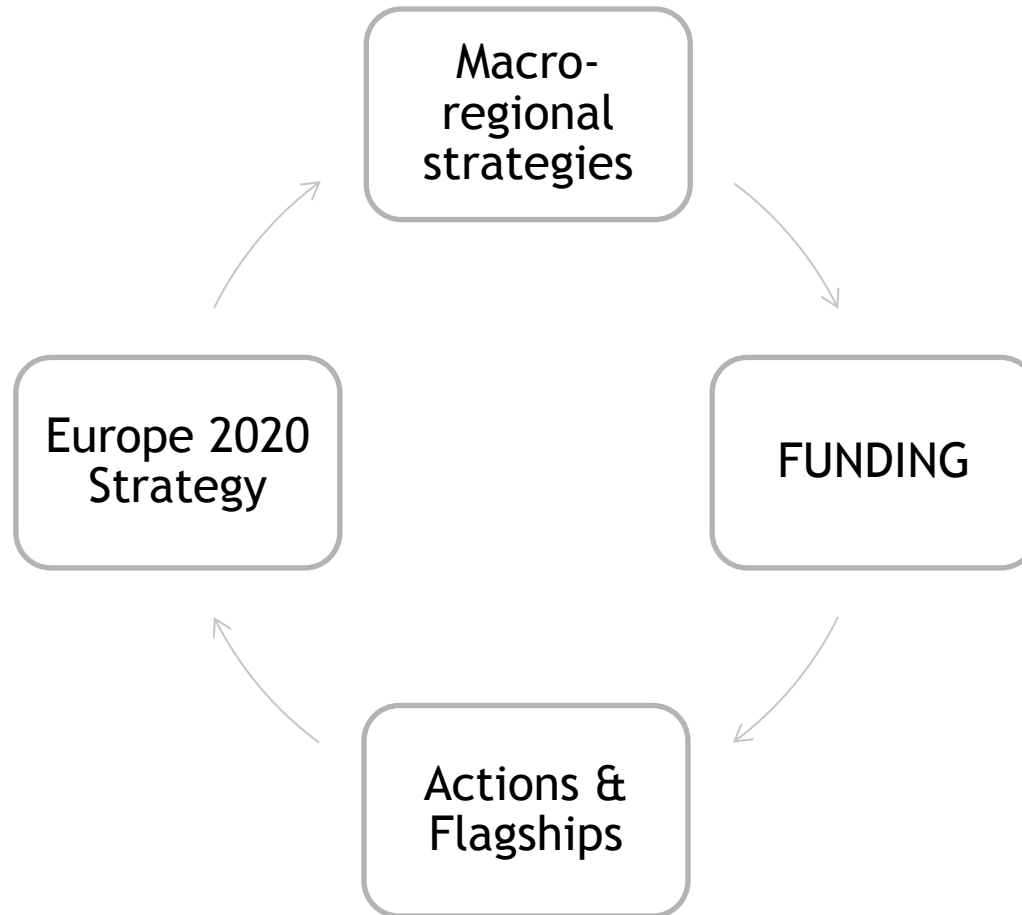

EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region

- First macro-regional strategy out of soon four strategies;
- 3 no; legislation, funding and institutions;
- A new way of working with EU funding, pro-active instead of re-active;
- Calls for multi-level governance.
- A revised Action Plan adopted in June 2015

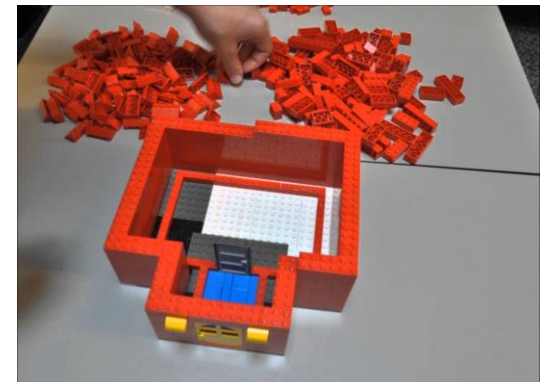
